


c Circle the correct form of the verb.

4 Class activities

a Last one standing

Stand on your desks/chairs. Your teacher will make some statements. If the concord is correct perform the activity.

For example: All the elephants **wave** their trunks (**wave** is the correct tense, so wave your imaginary trunk!) The children **laughs** out loud (**laughs** is the

wrong tense, so do not laugh)

If you make a mistake you are out of the game and have to sit down on your chair. The last one standing is the winner.



b Memory game

You and your learning partner will receive two sets of cards, one set marked "verb" and one set marked "subject". Write a *verb* (for example: *eat* or *eats*) on the back of each verb card and a *subject* (for example *she or Paola*) on the back of each subject card. Remember that the subject and verb have to agree.



Example: Place the cards face down. Player 1 turns one subject card and one verb card. If the verb agrees with the subject, player 1 wins that pair. If they do not agree, put them face down again. Switch turns. The player with the most pairs wins.

Example: Subject card: The cat Verb card: meows

"The cat meows" is a sentence where the verb agrees with the subject. You win that pair.

c Hot potato
