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Vote With Your Feet


Alias Cards

In this activity, you give one or several statements which the students have to take a stand on.

Everybody stands up. Explain that the students move to one side of the room if they agree to the statement, and to the other side if they disagree.

You may also put up signs saying 'Agree' or 'Disagree', and the students move to stand under the sign they agree with (signs enclosed).

The students who are not sure whether they agree or disagree, remain standing in the middle. Then you may follow up by asking the students who have taken a stand, to give an argument or try to persuade the students who have not decided, to make their decision.
